<p>The District believes that the economic recession, as well as the Allied/Republic merger, has created a reduction and displacement in both in-district and out-of-district waste generation. From 2008 to 2009, the District has recognized a waste reduction of 21%.</p> <p>The Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District realizes a steady increase in residential recycling rates. However, the commercial and industrial rates indicate an overall 9% reduction in recycling due to the fact that some companies who completed the survey for 2008 did not complete the survey for 2009.</p>

<p>The District recognized a decrease in overall waste generation and placement, including in-district, in 2009. As a result, there has also been a decrease in revenue.</p> <p>The District believes that this is a result of both the economic recession and the Allied/Republic merger. In addition, the City of Cleveland contract was awarded to an out-of-district competitor toward the end of 2009 and that waste stream left our District.</p> <p>The District believes there will be additional effects of the merger that will be realized in 2010.</p> <p>The District also believes that both commercial and industrial rates were affected by the fact that some companies (many referenced above) completed surveys for 2008 but did not complete surveys for 2009. Our District called many of those companies to encourage them to report their data but did not receive the information.</p>

C. Funding issues that affected the SWMD's operations during the report year or new issues anticipated to affect the SWMD:

A combination of factors over the past couple of years have caused the District to realize significant cash balance reductions. Declining disposal fee revenue due to the economic recession, displacement of waste from the Allied/Republic merger and waste contracts being awarded to competing out-of-district waste companies as well as the District being under an OEPA written plan and not having the flexibility to realign revenues and expenditures resulted in the District incurring net losses of \$3,307,940 in 2008 and \$2,173,660 in 2009. Relying on carryover cash balances, the District was able to continue its operations and fund programs in 2009 in compliance with its solid waste plan. However, a compromise of the District's request to better align its 2010 budget to projected activity was met by the OEPA to reduce expenditures by \$2,036,593, but it is still projected to overspend by at least \$1,000,000. Many program funding levels were reduced, such as health and sheriff department grants, or eliminated as a result of this budget reduction, including the household hazardous waste and appliance collections. The District re-evaluated all programs and the budget for the new draft solid waste plan being ratified for 2011 but will continue to operate under the current OEPA plan until that time.

D. Significant changes in revenue and/or expenditures from Plan projections:

Provide a brief explanation if revenue and expenditures for the report year deviated significantly from those projected in the SWMD's currently approved Plan.

The current Ohio EPA written plan projected the District would collect \$5,993,493 in 2009 compared to actual revenue of \$4,050,984. This represents a \$686,736, or 17%, reduction from 2008 actual revenue which is due to the following: 1) the sale of the Harvard Road Transfer Station in Cuyahoga County, Noble Road Landfill in Richland County and collection operations, from Republic Services to Rumpke during the summer of 2009 as required in the merger of Republic Services and Allied Waste; 2) The City of Cleveland trash contract being awarded to Rumpke rather than Republic Services, displacing waste from Countywide Landfill to Noble Road Landfill; and 3) continued effects of the economic recession. Revenue projections in the District's new 2010 - 2020 draft solid waste plan start at \$3,000,000 and slowly increase to \$3,500,000

Although the District was projected to spend \$7,767,238 during 2009 in the Ohio EPA plan and actually spent \$6,159,542, the year resulted in deficit spending of \$2,108,557.
